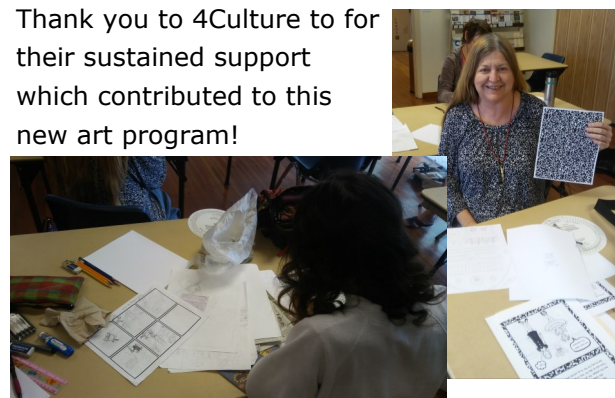
Norcliffe Foundation Grant!

Each time a grant is awarded, 10-15 facilities from the SCA waitlist are able to receive a 6-8 week long art program with all supplies provided for free to senior participants. Seniors Creating Art and local nonprofit Stephanie's Lifeline collaborated nearly 3 years ago to form the Knitting In A New Direction (KIND) program. Stephanie's Lifeline of H.O.P.E. is dedicated to serving less fortunate individuals and families in order to improve the quality of life of the most in need. In this collaborative program between SCA and H.O.P.E., seniors in the programs which SCA offers meet in order to learn to crochet and/or knit gloves, hats, scarves and blankets that can then be donated to the homeless individuals in the same community. This program provides purpose and even therapy to seniors while also filling a need among homeless individuals and families. Over 500 hats, 100 pairs of gloves, 200 scarves have been knitted and distributed to the homeless in our community.
